SPEECH PATHOLOGIST

Job Description

Alaska Center for Children and Adults, Inc. (ACCA) maintains this full or part time position. The employee will provide direct services in Speech/Language Therapy, and will report directly to the ACCA Executive Director.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- 1. Graduate of an accredited master's program in Speech Pathology. AND
- 2. Individual must have a Certificate of Clinical Competence in speech or be actively working towards a Certificate of Clinical Competence by pursuing the Clinical Fellowship Year.

JOB RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Provide Speech/Language Pathology Services with a caseload of children, their families, and adults, ensuring compliance with State, Federal, Insurance and Medicaid regulations and timelines in all aspects of services including but not limited to the following:
 - a. Conduct screening/diagnostic/therapy services, both on-site at the ACCA clinic and off-site in community locations, as the client's needs dictate.
 - b. Design therapeutic intervention plans with goals and objectives for speech therapy for each client assessed.
 - c. Provide follow-up to diagnostic and/or therapy sessions according to client's needs, including referral to other professionals and case management when appropriate.
 - d. Maintain accurate diagnostic and therapy reports in client folders.
 - e. Keep daily contact and billing logs updated.
 - f. Secure provider number and work in coordination with the Billing Specialist to generate payment through insurance providers and Medicaid for services provided.
 - g. Assist in development and facilitation of stroke group, social skills group, aphasia group, or other groups which may be offered both on-site and off site.
 - h. Participate as member of Infant Learning Program team to provide Speech/Language evaluations and therapies on as-needed basis.
- 2. Work as member of ACCA team to develop and implement goals, objectives and procedures of ACCA Speech Clinic.
- 3. Attend and participate in staff meetings, training and in-services at ACCA.
- 4. Participate in personnel supervision with ACCA Executive Director and clinical supervision with SLP supervisor as contracted by ACCA.
- 5. Participate in workshops and training sessions as needed for professional competence and development.

- 6. Demonstrate computer literacy to be self-sufficient in:
 - a. Basic computer software maintenance
 - b. Basic internet skills and safe internet practices
 - c. Writing, finding, saving and printing documents such as evaluation reports, correspondence and discharge summaries.
 - d. Utilization of agency e-mail system
 - e. Ensuring compliance with HIPPAA electronics compliance policies.
 - f. Entering data in ILP database
- 7. Complete administrative paperwork including, but not limited to:
 - g. mileage/travel expenses;
 - h. monthly timesheets;
 - i. monthly/quarterly data regarding client contacts;
 - j. semi-annual training logs
 - k. purchase order requests.
- 8. Support program and agency community relationships by participating in community outreach activities such as submission of articles for publication in the ACCA Community Connections newsletter.
- 9. Practice professional work habits including dependability, ethical practices, ethical communication, adherence to personnel policies and procedures, effective time management, independence, teamwork and responsibility. Maintain positive working relationships with co-workers and community members.
- 10. Pursue continuing education and professional growth experiences in the field of Early Intervention and Child Development, as well as in own professional field.
- 11. Adhere to the guidelines of ACCA policies and procedures.

WORK ENVIRONMENT AND PHYSICAL EFFORT
